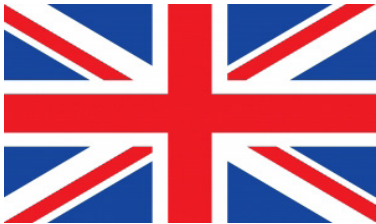


# DEATH'S DOOR SPIRITS BY THE NUMBERS

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**1%** of Death's Door Spirits' annual revenue is donated to Great Lakes causes.

Death's Door vodka, gin and whisky are distributed in **47 states** and **12 countries** including the U.K. and Singapore.



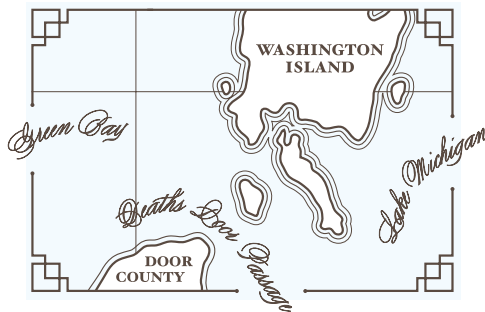
Death's Door Distillery opened its doors in Middleton in **2012.**

**3** botanicals are used in Death's Door Gin: organic juniper berries, coriander and fennel seeds.



**250,000** cases of finished product is the annual capacity for Death's Door's state-of-the-art distillery, making it the largest craft distillery in Wisconsin.

There are **350 shipwrecks** in the **5-mile** waterway that separates Washington Island from the Door County peninsula, named Death's Door Passage. Death's Door Spirits takes its name from this treacherous body of water.



**700** year-round residents live on Washington Island. The estimated average age of islanders is **58**-years-old.

Approximately **1/2 pound** of wheat is in every bottle of Death's Door vodka, gin and white whisky.



There are over **1,200 acres** of hard red winter wheat on the island due to farmers' efforts and support from Death's Door Spirits and Capital Brewery.

**16** employees work at Death's Door Distillery.

Over **100** people attended Death Door's sixth annual Juniper Harvest Festival on Washington Island this year.
